Building Permits

The Town of Harrison requires permits before starting construction and includes the installation of mobile homes. Building permits may be obtained from the Town Clerk.

A building permit that requires a new fire number costs \$50. This includes recreational structures that may need fire and ambulance services. In addition, all new residences require a Wisconsin Uniform Building permit obtained from a UDC inspector. Information can be obtained from the Town Clerk.

Any new non-residential building or changes in building dimensions requires a \$10 permit. Before getting a building permit, for any new access on all roads, you must get a driveway permit.

Minor structures **not requiring** a building permit shall include any small easily movable construction and any structure which is no more than 400 square feet (no foundation) or cost no more than \$5000 in materials.

Structures must be:

- Independent of any other structure
- A minimum of 45 feet from road center line (exception for school bus shelters) suggested 75 feet for future road improvements

Examples of minor structures not needing building permits:

Decks Farm calf hutches Gardening sheds Hoop or tarp sheds Outside woodstove/boilers Permanent deer stands (without living quarters, plumbing or running water) Play equipment School bus shelters Tool sheds Tree houses
